However, Victoria also faces urban challenges such as housing affordability, homelessness, and a toxic drug crisis. The legacy of colonialism also continues to affect the First Nations communities. In response, our mission is to prepare students to live fully and faithfully, navigating these complexities through the lens of Christian faith and a biblical worldview, fostering a deep understanding and proactive engagement with our community's unique challenges.

ROOTED IN BELONGING

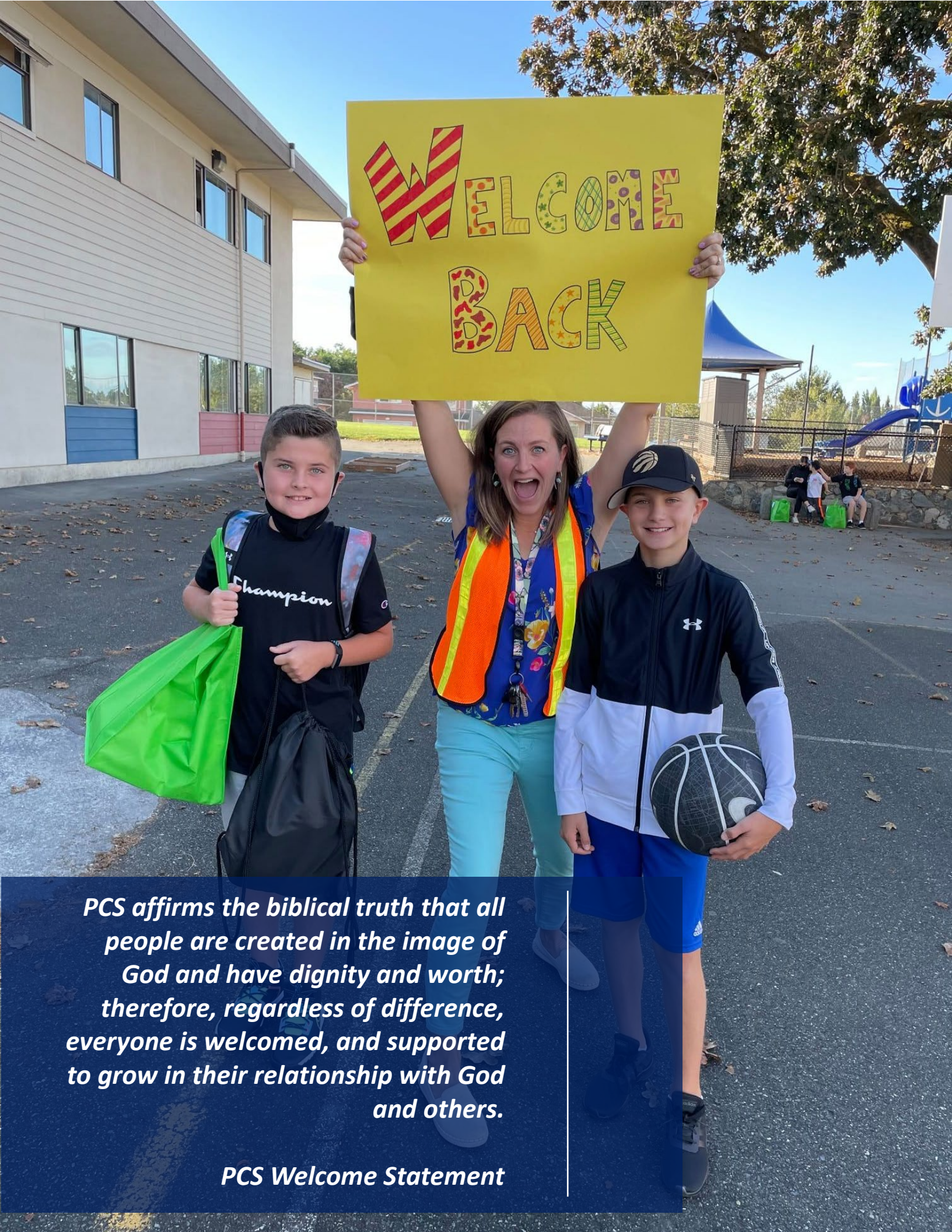

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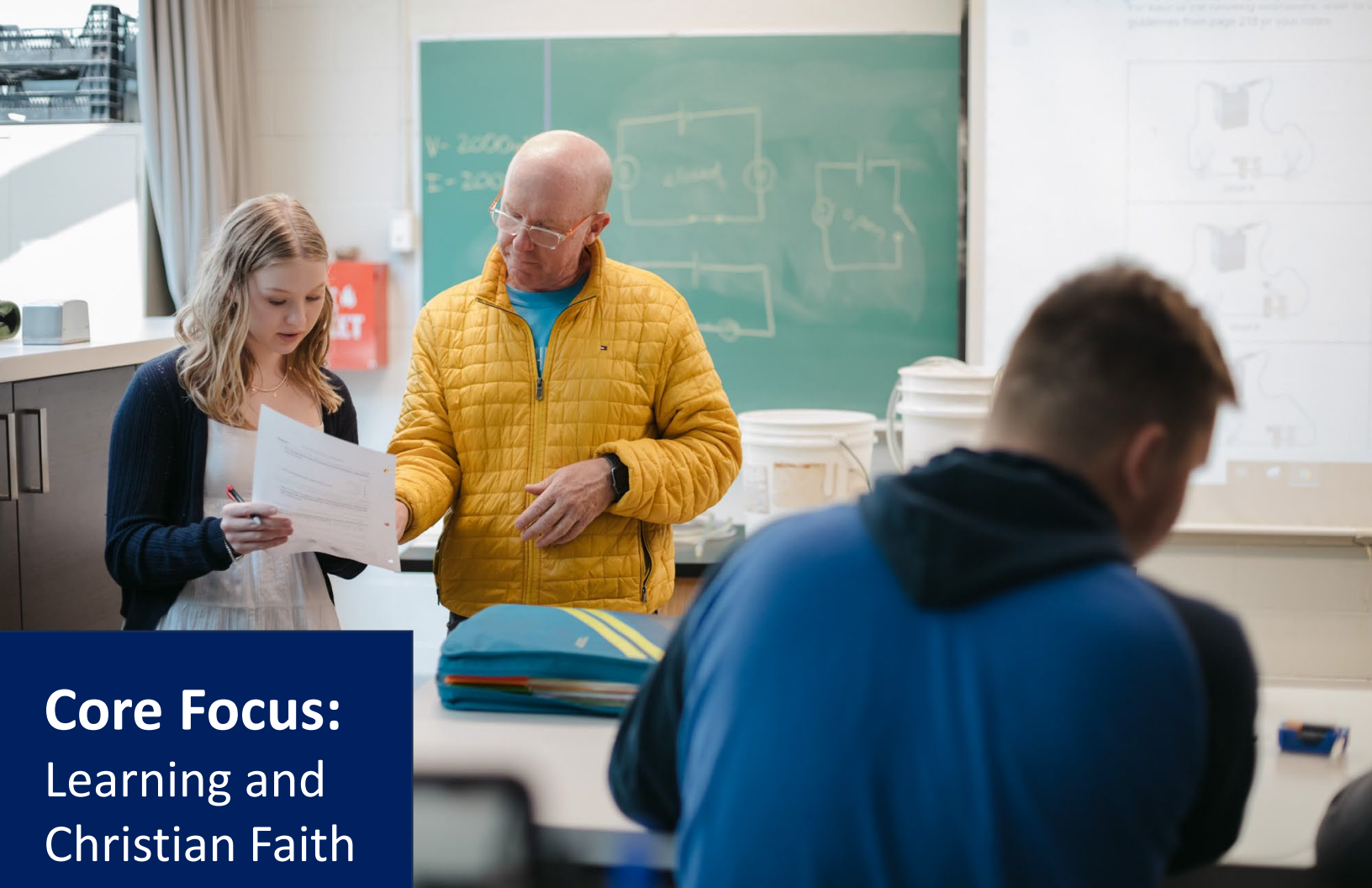


Core Focus, Strategic Priorities and Objectives
