Our Elementary School building houses preschool through grade seven, while grades eight through twelve are located in the Secondary School.



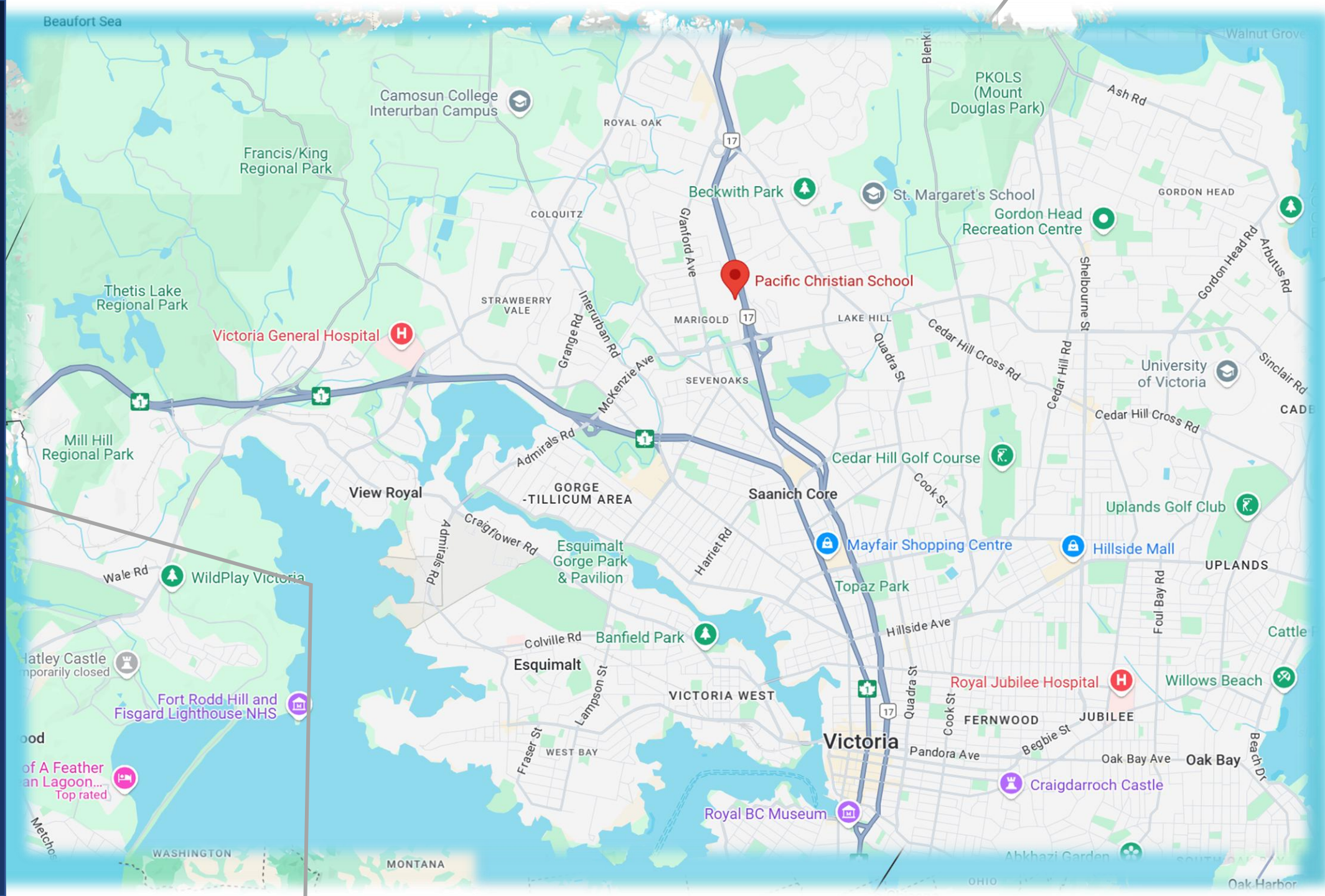
Location

Victoria, BC

is located on the West Coast of Canada, on Vancouver Island.

We are a short ferry ride away from Vancouver, and the city is home to just under 500,000 people.

PCS is centrally located in the city, and on main lines of public transportation. Local amenities are nearby for students to explore and shop.

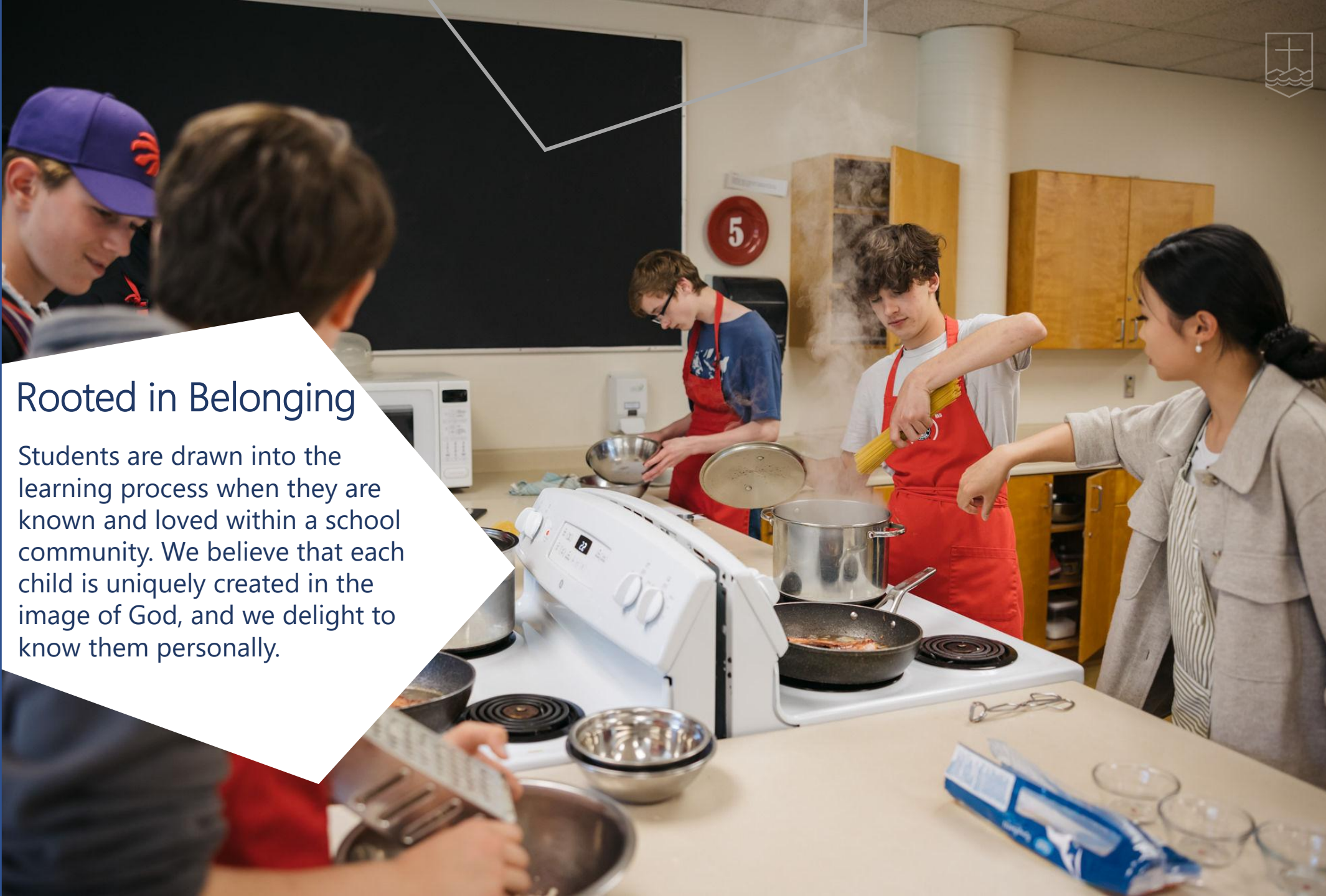


Guiding Principles

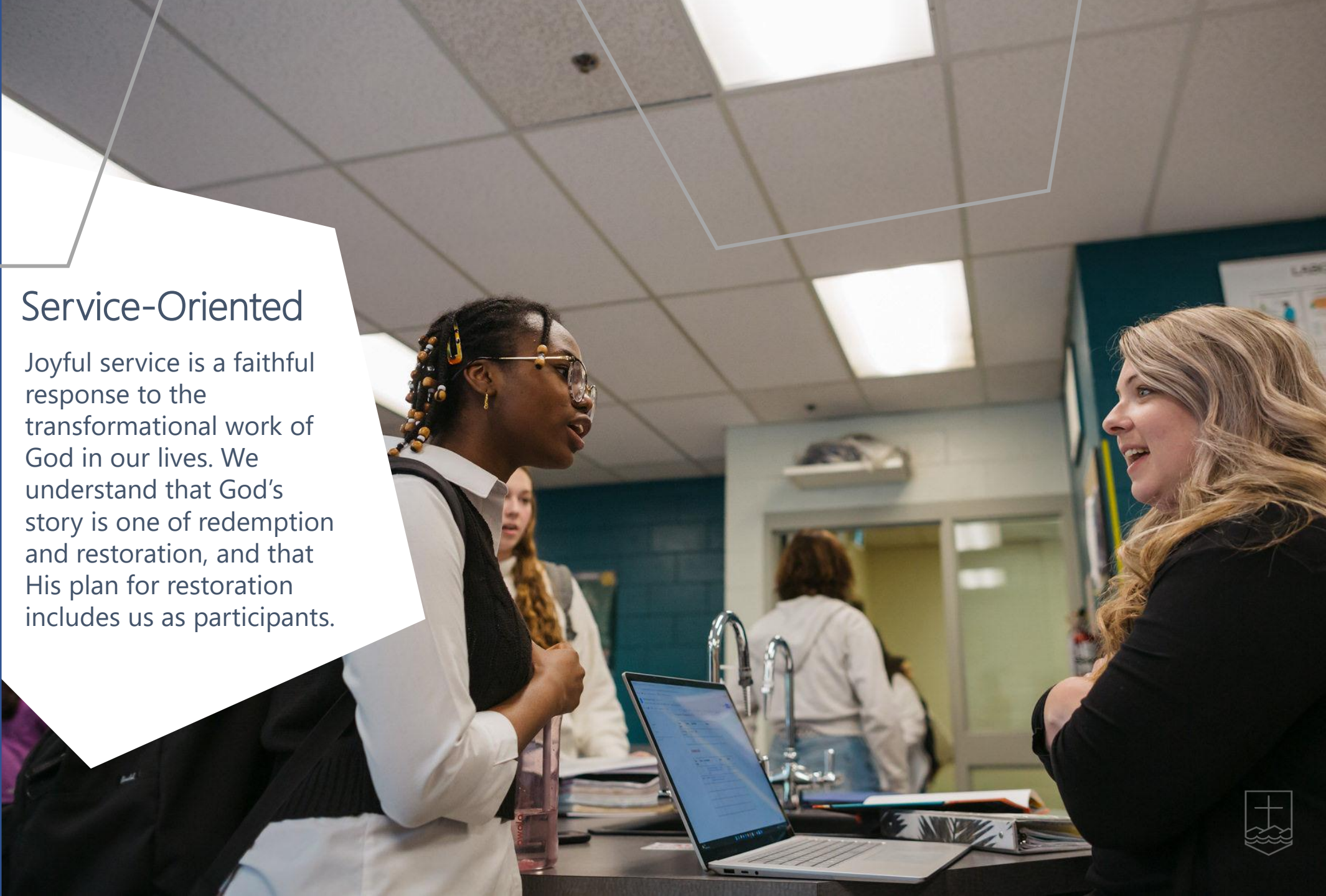


Guiding Principles

International Education

We create individualized EAL content in grades K through 7 and provide in-class support in mainstream courses in grades 8-12

Pacific Christian hosts international students from all over the world. We encourage students (domestic and international) to expand their worldviews as they learn more from their classmates.

It is a priority to help support them with their academic, social, and emotional needs.



Long-Term Programs

Students are expected to complete their graduation plan for a Dogwood Diploma.

A majority of our international students are looking ahead to post-secondary opportunities across Canada. Students and their families are looking for a community to support their children as they learn in a Canadian education system and grow in Christ. Most students remain here for a minimum of 3 years as they complete courses and language requirements.



Homestay Programs

Homestay families are crucial to supporting our International Program. Students are placed in homes with **local and PCS families** to have a full immersion experience.

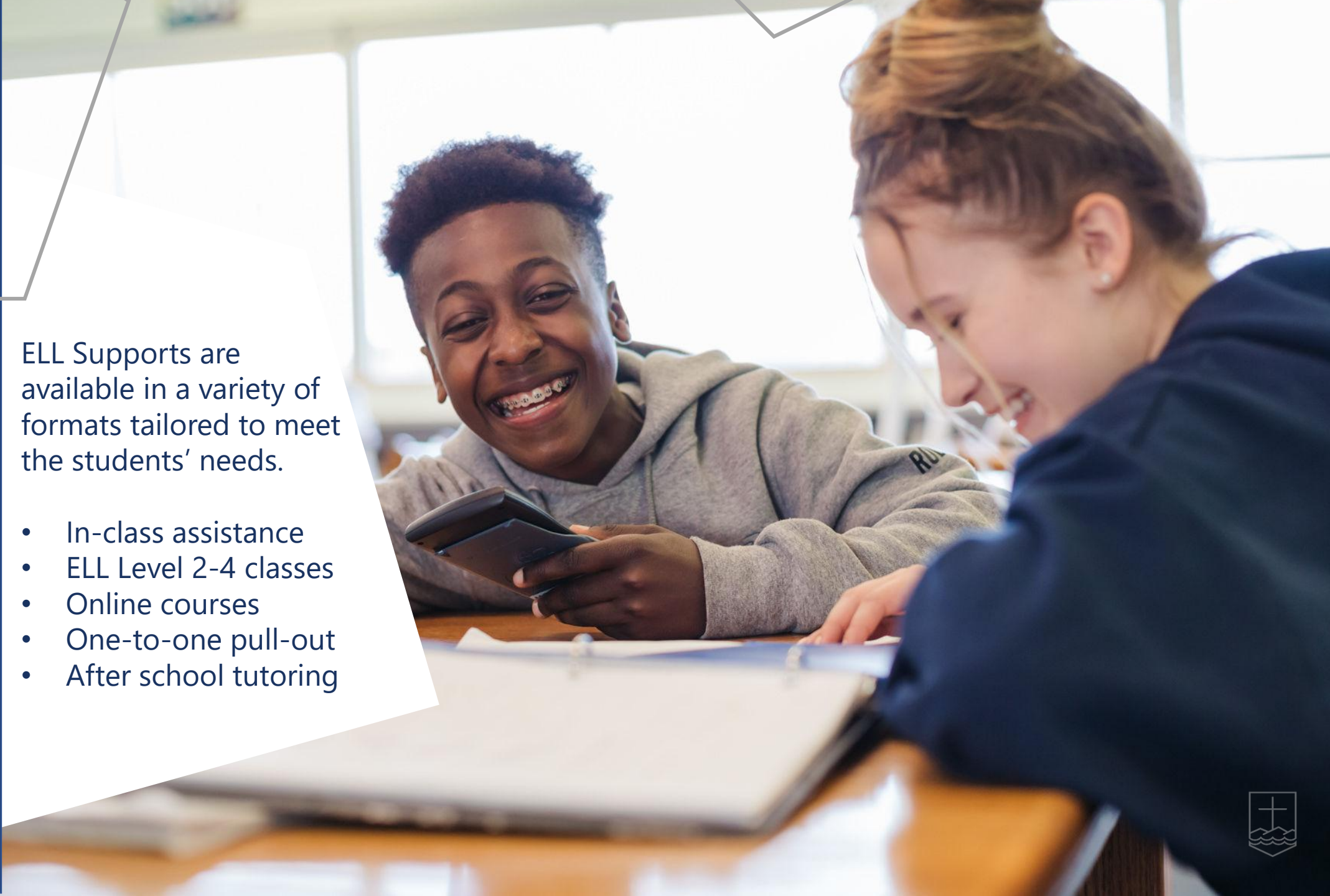
Often, the relationships built with our homestay families are the longest-lasting.

Sister School Program

PCS currently has two sister schools Programs in Japan:

Miyagi Gakuin (35+ years)

Hyogo International (25+ years)

We are expanding our programs to incorporate other cultures, focusing on fostering relationships in Mexico and possibly South Korea.

The school offers trips to Europe and Japan in alternating years.



Short-Term Programming

It is always a delight watching students share and learn from one another with cultural hands-on activities. Students are placed with PCS families for the duration of their stay.

Three-Six Month Programs

Over the course of the year, we host several short-term programs at the High School. Students are here between 3 days to 6 months! Often, we create cultural immersion experiences for our visitors across the campus.



New Student Orientation Program

We continue to offer an orientation program for new students studying in Canada. The program runs between 1-3 weeks, depending on the depth of the program required.

We provide guidance with regard to classroom and school expectations, community navigation, educational institutions, and tourist attractions. We also prepare students for in-session learning for Sept start.
